Grants that Foster Student Success, Civic Engagement

• We received a grant from the U.S. Department of Education to foster student success. Named "Maryland's ABCs for Student Success: Advising, Belonging and Coaching," the award will fund training for a cohort of peer mentors at institutions within USM. The Incentive Awards Program and University Career Center will lead this initiative on our campus! Mentors will help newly enrolled students navigate university life by connecting them with campus support resources. And, the relationship that new students experience with their mentors will help build a sense of belonging. This program will truly help students thrive.

• The Stamp's Leadership and Community Service Learning (LCSL) and TerpsVote programs, in partnership with the School of Public Policy, received a "Help America Vote College Program" grant from the U.S. Election Assistance Commission. This grant will support USM campuses as they encourage students to work as poll workers for elections over the next two years.
